- A CD matures 12/4 at Cornerstone, and the finance team authorized the treasurer to reinvest \$50K to another 12 mos. CD at 3.75%, with the balance to be put in a savings account at Cornerstone or into a 5 mos. CD at 4% which was approved by the finance team
